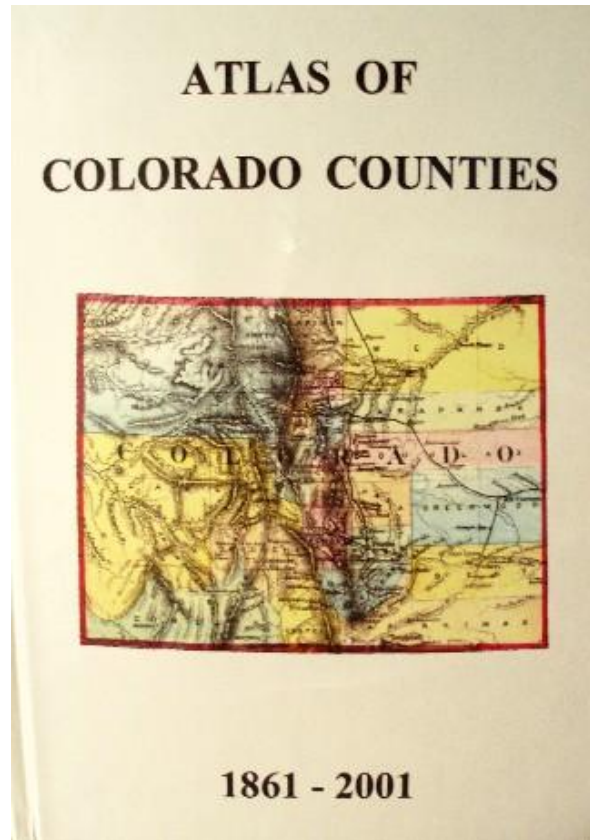


Thomas J. Overton

Thomas Overton began collecting maps while at school at the University Of Tennessee over thirty years ago. His interests include antique maps of Colorado and Tennessee as well as maps produced by John Speed in the first atlas of the world. Tom is one of the authors of the "Atlas of Colorado Counties," the first official publication of the Rocky Mountain Map Society, which provides a quick reference for dating antique Colorado maps.

Tom Overton is the founder of The Overton Law Firm and currently serves as President of the Rocky Mountain Map Society (RMMS). In July 2012, together with the RMMS planning committee and the Texas Map Society, Tom organized and directed an international symposium titled "The Mapping of North America: The Westward Expansion," (<http://www.rmmaps.org/2012-Conference/index.html>) hosted by the University of Denver.
