

## Dr. Susan Schulten



Dr. Susan Schulten is professor of history at the University of Denver, and currently chair of the department. She is the author of *Mapping the Nation: History and Cartography in Nineteenth-Century America* (2012) and *The Geographical Imagination in America, 1880-1950* (2001), both published with the University of Chicago Press. She was instrumental in organizing the joint RMMS/TMS international conference, "The Mapping of North America: The Westward Expansion" at DU in 2012.

In 2010 she was awarded a Guggenheim Fellowship for her research on the history of maps, and she contributes regularly to the "Disunion" series in the *New York Times*, which commemorates the sesquicentennial of the American Civil War. In 2013 the Pacific Coast Branch of the American Historical Association awarded *Mapping the Nation* the Hundley Prize, given annually for the most distinguished work of history written by a scholar living in the American and Canadian west.

Dr. Schulten has been a guest speaker at several RMMS meetings, as well as at professional conferences sponsored by map-related organizations such as the Newberry Library, the Library of Congress, and the Miami Map Fair. She teaches courses on Lincoln, the Civil War and Reconstruction, America at the turn of the century, the history of American ideas and culture, the Great Depression, the Cold War, war and the presidency, and the methods and philosophy of history at the University of Denver.
